Minutes
Regular Council Meeting
Wednesday March 18, 2020 at 7 p.m.

Mayor Sue Ann Rigano called this meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.
Council Members present were Mayor Pro-Tem Lowell Clawson, Gust Hatanelas and Debbra Morgan.
Dana Clawson was excused.
Others present Attorney Mike Roberts and Clerk Ashley Jones.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Public Comment: Lowell Clawson wanted to compliment Maintenance Man Hal Good for doing a great job on keeping the streets cleared and looking so nice with all the snow we have received this winter.

Debbra Morgan asked if the Town had a COVID-19 plan in place like other Towns are doing. The council came up with a new policy for safety of employees and residents that will take place Saturday March 21, 2020. The public notice states that due to the COVID-19 pandemic the Town of Bairoil is closing the gym and weight room for 30 days effective Saturday March 21, 2020. Your codes will no longer work for 30 days. Also any and all payments due to the Town of Bairoil either mail or put in the drop box outside Town Hall for the next 30 days effective Saturday March 21, 2020. Thank you for your cooperation.
Directed by Mayor and Council.

Approval of the minutes for the minutes of March 4, 2020 as they were posted according to law. With no changes necessary the minutes stand as written.

A motion was made by Debbra Morgan and seconded by Gust Hatanelas to approve the amended agenda of March 28, 2020. Motion passed.

Monthly Reports:

Police: There was none.

Court: There was no court held on March 4, 2020, no citations were issued. The next scheduled court date is April 1, 2020.

Water/Sewer: Water consumption is at 63,272 per day, daily usage for eleven days in March. The tank reading has averaged 20.5 feet with no over flow, which is below normal reading for this time of year. Probably due to the high consumption. The plant meter read 750,211 on March 2, 2020 and 960,180 on March 18, 2020 indicating a difference of 209,606. Average chlorine tests at 3.5/3.0 which is acceptable. We had to take a second set of water samples for the month of February during the first week of March due to the fact that the State Lab didn't pick the samples up from the Post Office in time. March samples were sent in when the road was open. Sewer Lagoons are in normal mode for this time of year with no

overflow. Water schools were coming up in April but have been canceled and rescheduled for the end of August.

Maintenance: There was a storm on March 1, 2020 with a several day clean up, Hal was off sick March 9 through March 13, 2020, went to Dr.s and it's not COVID-19. On Tuesday March 10, 2020 a mechanic from Wyoming Machinery came out and serviced the 906. There is an issue with the water at the Fire Hall backing up, not sure if it's the drain or not. A plumber from Silver Sage Plumbing came out and replaced the one toilet at the Fire Hall in the women's bathroom and will be coming out tomorrow to finish fixing the men's toilet at the Fire Hall and the urinal in the men's bathroom at Town Hall weather permitting. Cleaned up snow on Saturday March 14, 2020 and had plates made at Fritz Welding and Machine for the Town's plow.

Fire: The April fire training in Riverton has been canceled. On March 16, 2020 they had a fire department meeting where 7 volunteers were present, they drove trucks, E1 did not start and they changed the batteries in the SCBA packs.

Mayor's Report: There was none.

Old Business: The BLM will stay on the table until we hear back from the BLM on a price for the shooting range.

Lowell Clawson made a motion and Debbra Morgan seconded it to allow Amplify to dump their cooling tank water into the Town's lagoons if it met the requirements from the Town's Engineer Tom Pilch for a one time deal in the amount of \$15,000.00. Motion passed. Gust Hatanelas abstained due to pecuniary interest.

Engineer Tom Pilch sent us an email regarding Amplify's request to dump their cooling tank water into the Town's lagoon. Engineer Tom Pilch attached a copy of the sewer system "DEQ Sewer Permit" along with "Pilch Summary" which is notes for each of the requirements. With the biocide in the waste it should not be put into the first lagoon. Hopefully, once evaporated, the biocide would die. Probably should put the safety data sheets with the request. For the flash point, I assume placing in the second lagoon this is not an issue. PH must be documented to be greater than 5, but no more than 12. Need to do an oil and grease test, if greater than 10 ppm may trigger more testing. Lastly, how is the waste classified in your industry? I believe you indicated it is not listed hazardous waste. If it can be considered a characteristic hazardous waste we would need those tests to show that it is not a hazardous waste.


New Business: Councilman Lowell Clawson made a motion and was seconded by Gust Hatanelas to close the gym/weight room for 30 days while the COVID-19 pandemic is going on. Town Hall will be closed to the public for 30 days both go into effect Saturday March 21, 2020. Any and all bills must either be mailed or left in the drop box outside of Town Hall. Clerk Ashley Jones will mail residents their receipt of payments. Motion passed.

Debbra Morgan made a motion and was seconded by Gust Hatanelas to send out a notice of intent to file lien to residents and places of business who are months behind on their water/sewer payments. Motion passed.

No executive session was needed.

A motion was made by Lowell Clawson and seconded by Gust Hatanelas to pay Check# 14203 through Check# 14235 including debit card charges and EFT's for a total amount of \$15,243.35. Motion passed.

With no further business this council meeting was adjourned at 7:44 p.m.
