Minutes  
Regular Council Meeting  
Wednesday February 2, 2022 at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Pro-Tem Lowell Clawson called this meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. Council Members present were Stetler Hopkin, Sue Rigano and Alan Thornton. Others present were Attorney Terisa Oomens and Clerk Ashley Hopkin.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Public Comment: There was none.

Approval of the minutes for January 19, 2022 as they were posted according to law. With no changes necessary the minutes stand as written.

A motion was made by Alan Thornton and seconded by Stetler Hopkin to approve the amended agenda of February 2, 2022. Under new business number one will be Budgetary items, number two executive session matters confidential by law personnel and number three pay bills. Motion passed.

Mayor's Report: A notice will go out in the next water bills that if anyone is sick, feeling sick or showing any symptoms of getting sick to please stay out of Town Hall and do not attend the council meetings. Please use the drop box and if you have any questions, please call the Clerk's office. With everything going around we are trying to keep everyone healthy and not taking a chance of passing it onto others.

Rasmusson Furniture in Rawlins delivered the refrigerator to 106 Bluebell on Wednesday January 26, 2022. It is all hooked up and running well.

A notice went out to residents about the pet clinic on Thursday February 17, 2022 at 410 Indian Paintbrush (Healthcare Building). Another reminder will go out the end of next week.

The Town received an email from John Elliot the BLM Lander Field Manager on the updates for the shooting range. The Lander field office has completed all work possible at the local level and the balance of the process will be handled at the State office. The State office is in the process of routing the project through the various BLM tiers for review all the way through to Head Quarters. It usually has multiple reviews before signing off and posting the notice of realty action and they are estimating this will take three months.

The Fire Department is meeting this weekend and looking at the tanker truck to see what work needs to be done on it, get some numbers together and have it ready for the next council meeting.

Old Business: There was none.

New Business: Resolution number 2022-02 will be amended due to an error. Once the Attorney makes the changes moving money from the sewer account into the water account then it will go back on the agenda to get approved.

A motion was made by Alan Thornton and seconded by Stetler Hopkin to go into executive session at 7:40 p.m. to discuss personnel matters under Wyoming Statutes §16-4-405 (a)(iii). Motion passed. Council came back into regular session at 7:57 p.m. Mayor Pro-Tem Lowell Clawson asked the council if there was any objection as to what was discussed in executive session. No one objected.


