Minutes
Regular Council Meeting
Wednesday February 18, 2026 at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Lowell Clawson called this meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
Council Members present were Michelle Chavez, Audra Thornton, Alan Thornton, and Butch McFall.
Others present were Clerk Ashley Hopkin. Attorney was available by phone if needed (but not present).

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Public Comment: There was none.

Approval of the minutes for February 4, 2026, they were posted according to law. With no changes necessary, the minutes stand as written.

A motion was made by Alan Thornton, and seconded by Audra Thornton, to approve the agenda of February 18, 2026. Motion passed.

Monthly Reports:

Police: There was none.

Court: There was no court held this month. No citations were issued for the next court docket. The next scheduled court date is Wednesday March 4, 2026. Initial appearances will be conducted by phone at 4 pm. At that time an evidentiary hearing will be set for the following month for a time that will not interfere with the town council meetings.

Water/Sewer: There was a water leak at the end of Primrose, it was repaired and replaced with 2" poly. There was an issue with the sewer line in the alley between Shane Good's house and Gould's. Mass Grading from Rawlins came out with a camera and found a large root ball. They are checking on a rotor roter to break it up for now and then in the Spring it will be dug up and repaired. The BIO tests will be taken at either the end of this week weather permitting or the beginning of next week. The town's old water storage tank has been cut up and removed by Pacific Steel who were working through Bartlett Oilfield Service. The water tank level is 20.5 feet, and the chlorine is averaging 0.3. There are no issues with the sewer lagoons.

Maintenance: The large West door at the riding arena was fixed, the town's vehicles and equipment were moved back into the town shop, and there was a salt spill in the bed of the town's maintenance truck that was cleaned up and the bed was washed out. There were three doors from 107 Bluebell that the previous renters had taken off and moved to the town shop that were found and taken back to 107 Bluebell and put back on, the striker plates to the doors are still missing. Service was done to the 906, 920 the town truck, plow truck and the equipment attachments. Inventory was done on the town's

tools, after the previous maintenance guy the town recovered two of the four items missing. The burn pit was lit off two times and cleaning around the burn pit and staging area was done. The gate at the burn pit was repaired, drove a t post and installed a screen on a vent pipe at the end of Primrose, began work on cleaning up from a water leak at the end of Primrose, shoveling and plowing snow has been done.

Fire: There was a meeting held on February 2, 2026, where they had four volunteers present. They drove E-1, E-2 and the brush truck. They fueled up E-1 and E-2, discussed weekend schedule and EMR training. There was a special meeting on February 9th where four volunteers received a Carbon County dispatch text for a 911 call at 503 Antelope for a 77-year-old female with chest pains, high blood pressure and a history of heart issues. Carbon County EMT and Life Flight were dispatched. The four Bairoil volunteers assisted with the resident until the ambulance and Life Flight arrived. The resident was stabilized and flown to Casper Medical. There was a meeting held on February 16, where they had four volunteers present. They discussed By-Laws and possible new members and weekend schedule. They talked about the latest 911 call for a resident, and residents not living in Bairoil. They assigned Audra Thornton as training officer and Butch McFall as secretary. They would like to order response bags.

Mayor's Report: The Town received a letter from the Department of Revenue stating that we were in compliance for tax year 2026.

Bartlett Oilfield Service has started clearing an area at the shooting range for the towns new shooting shed and are going to be putting gravel in and installing a culvert.

Old Business: There was none.

New Business: No executive session was needed.


